Jesus Christ the Ark

1Pe 3:21 There is also an antitype which now saves us—baptism (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ,



Jesus Christ the Ark

- A witness that the Apostles viewed Genesis as literal history.
- Our sin was destroyed in Judgment as in the Flood.
- Christ is our refuge as the Ark



Genesis as History

Mat 19:3-6 The Pharisees also came to Him, testing Him, and saying to Him, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for just any reason?" (4) And He answered and said to them, "Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning 'MADE THEM MALE AND FEMALE,...



Genesis as History

Mat 19:3–6 ...(5) and said, 'FOR THIS REASON A MAN SHALL LEAVE HIS FATHER AND MOTHER AND BE JOINED TO HIS WIFE, AND THE TWO SHALL BECOME ONE FLESH' ?
(6) So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate."



Our Sin Destroyed

Gen 7:20–24 The waters prevailed fifteen cubits upward, and the mountains were covered. (21) And all flesh died that moved on the earth: birds and cattle and beasts and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, and every man. (22) All in whose nostrils was the breath of the spirit of life, all that was on the dry land, died...



Our Sin Destroyed

Gen 7:20–24 ... (23) So He destroyed all living things which were on the face of the ground: both man and cattle, creeping thing and bird of the air. They were destroyed from the earth. Only Noah and those who were with him in the ark remained alive. (24) And the waters prevailed on the earth one hundred and fifty days.



Our Sin Destroyed

Rom 6:4–6 Therefore we were buried with Him through **baptism** into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life...



Our Sin Destroyed

Rom 6:4–6 ... (5) For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection, (6) knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin.



Jesus Christ is Our Refuge

Rom 6:3–5 Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? (4) Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life...



Jesus Christ is Our Refuge

Rom 6:3–5 ... (5) For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection.



Jesus Christ is Lord

1Pe 3:22 who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, angels and authorities and powers having been made subject to Him.
