# Christ Redeemed Us by His Own Blood

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV But Christ being come an high priest of good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this building; (12) Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us...



# Christ Redeemed Us by His Own Blood

1 Peter 1:13–19 NKJV Therefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and rest your hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; (14) as obedient children, not conforming yourselves to the former lusts, as in your ignorance; (15) but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct,...



# Christ Redeemed Us by His Own Blood

1 Peter 1:13–19 NKJV ...(16) because it is written, "BE HOLY, FOR I AM HOLY."  
(17) And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay here in fear;...



# Christ Redeemed Us by His Own Blood

1 Peter 1:13–19 NKJV ... (18) knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, (19) but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.



# Christ Redeemed Us by His Own Blood

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ...(13) For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh: (14) How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?...



# A Testament Requires the Death of the Testator

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ... (15) And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions that were under the first testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance. (16) For where a testament is, there must also of necessity be the death of the testator...



# A Testament Requires the Death of the Testator

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ... (17) For a testament is of force after men are dead: otherwise it is of no strength at all while the testator liveth. (18) Whereupon neither the first testament was dedicated without blood. (19) For when Moses had spoken every precept to all the people according to the law, he took the blood of calves and of goats, with water, and scarlet wool, and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book, and all the people, ..



# A Testament Requires the Death of the Testator

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ... (20) Saying, This is the blood of the testament which God hath enjoined unto you. (21) Moreover he sprinkled with blood both the tabernacle, and all the vessels of the ministry. (22) And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission...



# The New Testament More Perfectly Follows This Pattern

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ... (23) It was therefore necessary that the patterns of things in the heavens should be purified with these; but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. (24) For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us:...



# The New Testament More Perfectly Follows This Pattern

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ...(25) Nor yet that he should offer himself often, as the high priest entereth into the holy place every year with blood of others; (26) For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself...



# The New Testament More Perfectly Follows This Pattern

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV...(27) And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment: (28) So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation..



# The Mosaic Covenant was Only a Shadow of the New Covenant

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV...(10:1) For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect...



# The Mosaic Covenant was Only a Shadow of the New Covenant

Colossians 2:16-17 NKJV So let no one judge you in food or in drink, or regarding a festival or a new moon or sabbaths, (17) which are a shadow of things to come, but the substance is of Christ.



# The Mosaic Covenant was Only a Shadow of the New Covenant

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ...(10:2) For then would they not have ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins. (3) But in those sacrifices there is a remembrance again made of sins every year...



# The Mosaic Covenant was Only a Shadow of the New Covenant

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV  
...(10:4) For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins.



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Hebrews 9:11-10:18 KJV ...(10:5)  
Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me: (6) In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin thou hast had no pleasure...



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ...(10:7) Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me,) to do thy will, O God. (8) Above when he said, Sacrifice and offering and burnt offerings and offering for sin thou wouldest not, neither hadst pleasure therein; which are offered by the law;...



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Psalms 40:6-8 NKJV Sacrifice and offering You did not desire; My ears You have opened. Burnt offering and sin offering You did not require. (7) Then I said, "Behold, I come; In the scroll of the book it is written of me. (8) I delight to do Your will, O my God, And Your law is within my heart."



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ...(10:9) Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second. (10) By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. (11) And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins:..



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ...(10:12) But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God; (13) From henceforth expecting till his enemies be made his footstool. (14) For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified...



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV ... (10:15)  
Whereof the Holy Ghost also is a witness to us: for after that he had said before, (16) This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them;...



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Hebrews 9:11–10:18 KJV  
...(10:17) And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more. (18) Now where remission of these is, there is no more offering for sin.



# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Jeremiah 31:33–34 NKJV But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people...



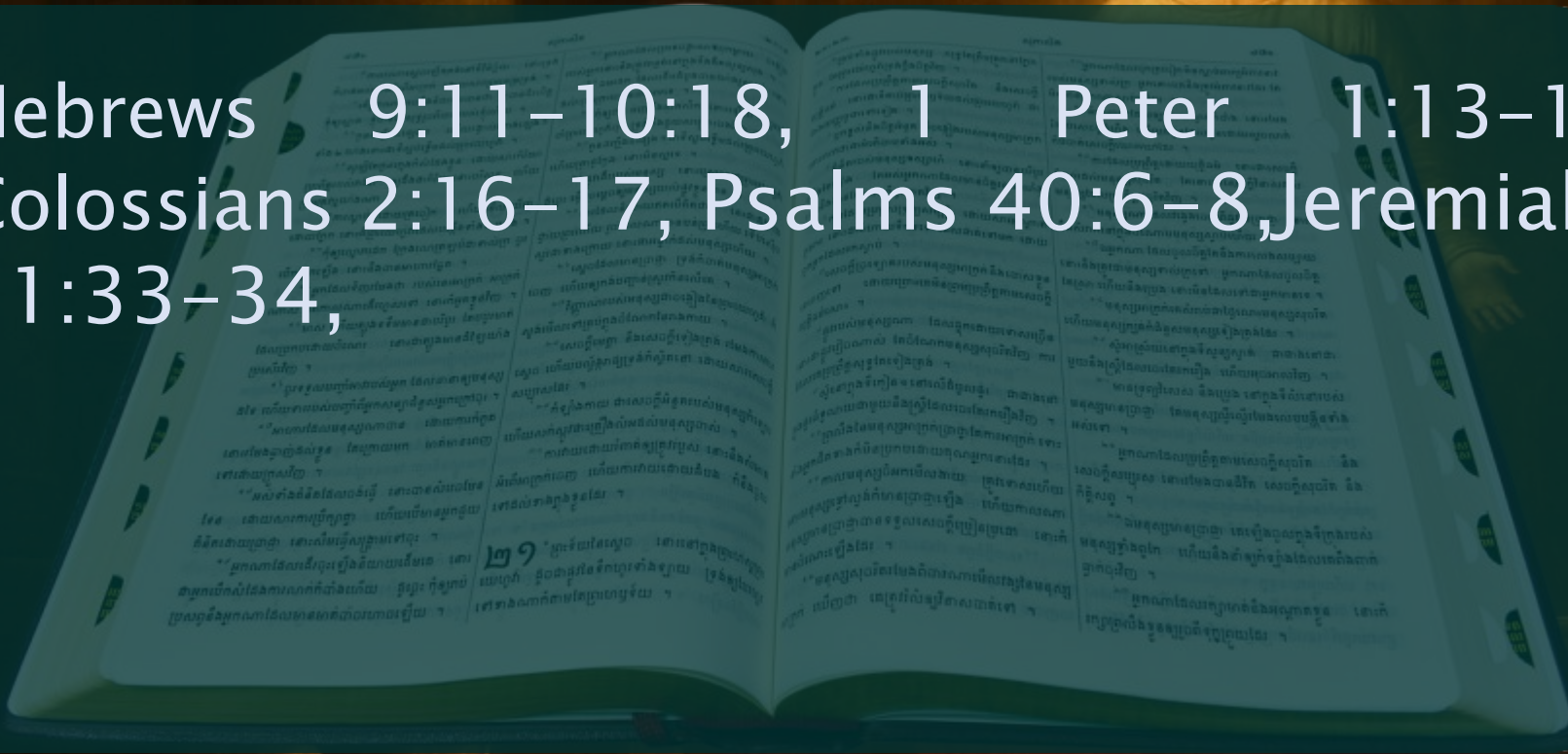
# The New Covenant was Adequate to Take Away Sin

Jeremiah 31:33-34 NKJV ...(34) No more shall every man teach his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they all shall know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them, says the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more."
